ENHANCING THE CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OF FILIPINO PROFESSIONALS AS AN INTEGRAL COMPONENT OF CAREER PROGRESSION AND SPECIALIZATION PROGRAMS, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 10912, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT ACT OF 2016"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION. 1. Section 3 of Republic Act No. 10912 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 3. *Definition of Terms*. – [The following terms shall be defined under] AS USED IN this Act:

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(E) CAREER PROGRESSION REFERS TO THE PROCESS OF DEVELOPING OR MOVING TOWARDS A MORE ADVANCED STATE IN A PERSON'S QUALIFICATIONS, JOB, TITLE, POSITION, OR PROFESSION. IT OUTLINES THE ROUTE THAT ONE MAY FOLLOW IN ORDER TO REACH IDENTIFIED CAREER DEVELOPMENT GOALS;

BY THE CPSP-CATS;

(F) CAREER PROGRESSION AND SPECIALIZATION PROGRAM AND CREDIT ACCUMULATION AND TRANSFER SYSTEM (CPSP-CATS) COMMITTEE REFERS TO THE BODY THAT PROVIDES TECHNICAL SUPPORT TO THE CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT (CPD) COUNCIL AND THE BOARD OF EACH PROFESSION IN THE FORMULATION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CPSP-CATS, SUCH AS PROGRAM AND LEARNING OUTCOMES FOR EVERY IDENTIFIED QUALIFICATION TITLE OF THE PROFESSION AND RECOMMENDS TO THE COUNCIL THE FORMULATION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NECESSARY PROGRAMS AND POLICIES TO BE IMPLEMENTED

(G) CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION REFERS TO THE DOCUMENT ISSUED BY THE PROFESSIONAL REGULATION COMMISSION (PRC) SIGNIFYING THAT THE PERSON NAMED THEREIN HAS COMPLIED

WITH ALL THE LEGAL AND PROCEDURAL REQUIREMENTS FOR SUCH ISSUANCE, INCLUDING, IN APPROPRIATE CASES, PASSING THE LICENSURE EXAMINATION OR REGISTRATION WITHOUT EXAMINATION;

[(e) Competence refers to an ability that extends beyond the possession of knowledge and skills, which include cognitive, functional, personal and ethical competence;]

(H) COMPETENCY REFERS TO THE CAPABILITY TO APPLY OR USE A SET OF KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES REQUIRED TO SUCCESSFULLY PERFORM AND IMPLEMENT CRITICAL WORK FUNCTIONS OR TASKS IN A DEFINED WORK SETTING;

[(f)] (I) Continuing Professional Development [or] (CPD) refers to the [inculcation] ACQUISITION of advanced knowledge, skills and ethical values in a post-licensure specialization or in an inter- or multidisciplinary field of study, for assimilation into professional practice, [self-directed research and/] or lifelong learning;"

[(g)] (J) CPD Council refers to a body created to promote and ensure the continuous improvement of professionals, in accordance with national, regional and international standards of practice;

[(h)] (K) CPD credit unit refers to the value of an amount of learning that can be transferred to a qualification achieved from formal [, informal or] AND nonformal learning setting [,] wherein credits can be accumulated to predetermined levels for the award of a qualification;

[(i)] (L) CPD Program refers to a set of STRUCTURED learning activities accredited by the CPD Council such as seminars, workshops, technical lectures or subject matter meetings, nondegree training lectures and scientific meetings, [modules, tours and visits,] which equip [the] professionals with advanced knowledge, skills and values in A specialized or [in an] inter- or multidisciplinary field of study[, self-directed research and /or lifelong learning];

[(j)] (M) CPD Provider refers to a natural or juridical person accredited by the CPD Council to conduct CPD Programs;

(N) CREDIT ACCUMULATION AND TRANSFER SYSTEM FOR PROFESSIONALS REFERS TO A LEARNER-CENTERED SYSTEM WHICH FACILITATES THE RECOGNITION, ACCUMULATION, TRANSFER, AND MOBILITY OF THE WORK EXPERIENCE OR WORK CREDENTIALS OF PROFESSIONALS AND THE ACHIEVEMENT OF LEARNING OUTCOMES TO ENABLE THEM TO ACQUIRE A

PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATION OR ANY OTHER FORM OF RECOGNITION IN ANY AREA OR FIELD OF EXPERTISE;

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(O) CREDITS REFER TO THE VALUE GIVEN TO A LEARNING OUTCOME OR A PACKAGE OF LEARNING OUTCOMES;

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[(k)] (P) Formal learning refers to educational arrangements such as curricular qualifications and teaching-learning requirements that take place in education and training institutions recognized by relevant national authorities, and which lead to THE CONFERMENT OF diplomas and qualifications;

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[(1) Informal learning refers to learning that occurs in daily life assessed, through the recognition, validation and accreditation process, and which can contribute to a qualification;]

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[(m)] (Q) Learning outcomes refer to what a learner can be expected to know, understand [and/] or demonstrate as a result of a learning experience;

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[(n)] (R) Lifelong learning refers to learning activities undertaken throughout life for the development of competencies and qualifications of the professional;

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[(o)] (S) Nonformal learning refers to [learning that has been acquired in addition or alternatively to formal learning, which may be structured and made more flexible according to educational and training arrangements] STRUCTURED ACTIVITIES WHICH HAVE LEARNING PROCESSES AND PRE-DETERMINED OUTCOMES SUCH AS A HIGHER EDUCATION DEGREE OR DIPLOMA OR CERTIFICATE COURSES, INSTITUTION OR COMPANY-SPONSORED TRAINING PROGRAMS AND SEMINARS, SPECIALTY TRAINING, AND ONLINE LEARNING ACTIVITIES THAT ARE DELIVERED ACCORDING TO APPROVED SYLLABI AND WHICH ARE RELATED TO ONE'S PROFESSION;

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[(p)] (T) Online OR DIGITAL learning activities OR APPROACHES refer to [structured or unstructured] FORMAL AND NONFORMAL learning initiatives, which make use of the internet and other web-based Information Communications Technology solutions. **INCLUDING** FOLLOWING: 1) ONLINE SEMINARS AND WORKSHOPS, WHICH ARE SYNCHRONOUS ONLINE LEARNING APPROACHES; 2) E-LEARNING, ANASYNCHRONOUS SELF-PACED, ANYTIME, ANYWHERE LEARNING APPROACH; 3) MICROLEARNING WHICH IS AN EDUCATIONAL STRATEGY THAT BREAKS COMPLEX TOPICS DOWN INTO SHORT-FORM, STAND-ALONE UNITS OF STUDY THAT CAN BE VIEWED AS MANY TIMES AS NECESSARY, WHENEVER AND WHEREVER THE LEARNER HAS THE NEED. **THROUGH** MICROLEARNING INSTRUCTIONAL **MODULES** THAT DESIGNED TO BE CONSUMED IN ABOUT FIVE MINUTES AND

 [(t)] (BB) Professional refers to a person who is registered and licensed to practice a regulated profession in the Philippines and who holds a valid Certificate of Registration and Professional Identification Card (PIC) from the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC);

(CC) PROFESSIONAL IDENTIFICATION CARD REFERS TO THE CARD BEARING THE REGISTRATION NUMBER, DATES OF ISSUANCE AND EXPIRY, AND IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE, DULY SIGNED BY THE PRC CHAIRPERSON AND ISSUED TO A REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL UPON PAYMENT OF THE PRESCRIBED FEE, AND WHICH IS VALID FOR THREE (3) YEARS;

[(w) Self-directed learning refers to learning activities such as online training, local/international seminars/nondegree courses, institution/company-sponsored training programs, and the like, which did not undergo CPD accreditation but may be applied for and awarded CPD units by the respective CPD Council;]

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(II) SPECIALTY TRAINING REFERS TO A NONDEGREE POSTGRADUATE STRUCTURED TRAINING PROGRAM WITH ASSESSMENT MECHANISMS, CONDUCTED BY ANY COMPANY, PUBLIC OR PRIVATE, OR HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTION."

(D) PROFESSIONALS WHO WISH TO BE ISSUED A CERTIFICATE OF GOOD STANDING (COGS) BY THEIR AIPO AS INDICATED IN THEIR PRL, SHALL COMPLY WITH THE CPD REQUIREMENT, WHICH IN NO CASE SHALL BE LESS THAN FORTY-FIVE (45) CREDIT UNITS; AND

(E) DURING A PANDEMIC, STATE OF CALAMITY OR NATIONAL EMERGENCY, THE PRC MAY TEMPORARILY SUSPEND THE COMPLIANCE PERIOD FOR CPD REQUIREMENTS INDEFINITELY OR EXTEND THE END OF THE SAID COMPLIANCE PERIOD TO THE EQUIVALENT DURATION OF THE PANDEMIC, CALAMITY OR NATIONAL EMERGENCY.

(C) THE PRBs AND THE CPSP-CATS COMMITTEE, TOGETHER WITH THE ACCREDITED SPECIALTY SOCIETY OR SIMILAR PROFESSIONAL SPECIALTY ORGANIZATION SHALL DETERMINE THE REQUIRED NUMBER OF QF CREDITS REQUIRED FOR THE CONFERMENT OF QUALIFICATION LEVELS OR PURSUANT TO THE PQF;

THEY MAY CREATE MECHANISMS WHERE QUALIFIED PROFESSIONALS FROM GOVERNMENT **OUTSIDE** THE **AGENCIES** OR **PRIVATE** COMPANIES MAY BE ALLOWED TO JOIN THE SAID SEMINAR, WORKSHOPS AND ONLINE OR SIMILAR TRAINING PROGRAM AND EARN CPD CREDITS."

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SEC. 9. A new Section 15 is hereby inserted to read as follows:

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"SEC. 15. ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTIES. – WHEN THE FAILURE TO OBTAIN REQUIRED CPD CREDITS IS SOLELY DUE TO THE FAILURE OF THE CONCERNED AGENCIES OR THE PERSONS RESPONSIBLE TO PROPERLY IMPLEMENT THE CPD PROGRAM IN THE LOCATION AND PROFESSION OF THE CONCERNED PROFESSIONALS, THE PERSONS OR AGENCIES RESPONSIBLE

SHALL BE ADMINISTRATIVELY LIABLE IN ACCORDANCE WITH RELEVANT LAWS FOR THE FAILURE TO PROPERLY IMPLEMENT THE CPD PROGRAM, UPON COMPLIANCE WITH DUE PROCESS: *PROVIDED*, THAT THE PROFESSIONAL HAS EXERCISED DUE DILIGENCE IN COMPLYING WITH THE CPD REQUIREMENTS CONSIDERING THE CIRCUMSTANCES."

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SEC. 10. Section 15 of Republic Act No. 10912 is hereby renumbered as Section 16 and is hereby amended to read as follows:

[15.] 16. *Implementing Rules and Regulations*. - The PRC and the PRBs[,] SHALL, in consultation with the VARIOUS AIPOS/APOS, CSC, DOLE, and other RELEVANT stakeholders, [shall] promulgate the implementing rules and regulations (IRR) within six (6) months from the effectivity of this Act. However, a PRB may prescribe its own requirements or procedure relating to the CPD as may be pertinent and applicable to the specific profession: *Provided*, That the same does not contravene any of the provisions of this Act and its IRR.

SEC. 11. Sections 16, 17, 18, and 19 of Republic Act No. 10912 are hereby renumbered as Sections 17, 18, 19, and 20, respectively.

SEC. 12. Separability Clause. - If any part or provision of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the other parts or provisions not affected shall remain in full force and effect.

SEC. 13. Repealing Clause. - All laws, decrees, executive orders and other administrative issuances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, are repealed or modified accordingly.

SEC. 14. Effectivity. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.

OBJECTIVES:

- To enhance and strengthen the continuing professional development (CPD) of the country's professionals to improve their skills and make them at par with professionals from other countries
- To address the limitations of Republic Act. No. 10912, otherwise known as the "Continuing Professional Development Act of 2016"
- To exempt from CPD requirements certain categories or groups of professionals

KEY PROVISIONS:

- Makes the CPD a mandatory requirement in the updating and upgrading of knowledge, skills and values and competencies or titles of all registered and licensed professionals under the regulation of the Professional Regulation Commission (PRC) and as one of the main objectives of the Philippine Qualifications Framework (PQF) under Republic Act No. 10968 (Philippine Qualifications Framework Act)
- Mandates that all professionals shall be required to obtain forty-five (45) CPD credit units every four (4) years which shall be deemed as the compliance period
- Exempts some professionals from the CPD requirements, such as the newly licensed or registered professionals on the first renewal of their Professional Identification Card within the first four (4) years after obtaining their license; Overseas Filipino Workers and senior citizens who are not engaged in the practice of their profession, as defined under their respective regulatory laws
- Provides that professionals who are covered by Mutual Recognition Arrangements (MRAs) who may wish that their profession and qualifications be internationally recognized, shall comply with the required CPD units as prescribed in the MRAs which in no case shall be less than forty-five (45) credit units
- Mandates that the CPD shall be a beneficial and integrated component in the upgrading of qualification standards and title towards Career Progression and Specialization Program (CPSP) and Credit Accumulation and Transfer System (CATS) and for this purpose, the PRC and the Professional Regulatory Boards shall create the CPSP-CATS committee for each profession to assist the CPD council and the PRBs in the implementation of CPSP-CATS
- Grants the PRC the authority, during a pandemic, state of calamity, or national emergency, to temporarily suspend the compliance period for CPD requirements indefinitely or extend the end of the said compliance period to the equivalent duration of the pandemic, state of calamity or national emergency
- Directs the various government departments and agencies, and private companies, in consultation and coordination with the PRC, to establish a mechanism whereby they shall provide professionals under their jurisdiction, with free or inexpensive seminars, workshops, online and similar training programs, to earn CPD

credit units, with no or very low cost to the professionals and that they may create mechanisms where qualified professionals from outside the government department or agency or private company may be allowed to join the said seminar, workshop and online or similar training program and earn CPD credit units

- Orders all government agencies, including government-owned and controlled corporations, to include in their annual budget an allocation for the conduct of free trainings and seminars for their professional employees
- Directs concerned government agencies, public higher education institutions, and other public institutions to provide full funding for the CPD compliance of professionals employed by them
- Mandates that the in-service trainings for teachers being implemented by the Department of Education, which are structured and with clear-cut learning processes and outcomes, shall be considered as part of the CPD Program
- Provides administrative penalties for failure to implement properly the CPD program subject to certain conditions
