AMENDING SECTION 3 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7797, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "AN ACT TO LENGTHEN THE SCHOOL CALENDAR FROM TWO HUNDRED (200) DAYS TO NOT MORE THAN TWO HUNDRED TWENTY (220) CLASS DAYS"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Section 3 of Republic Act No. 7797, otherwise known as "AN ACT TO 1 LENGTHEN THE SCHOOL CALENDAR FROM TWO HUNDRED (200) DAYS TO NOT 2 MORE THAN TWO HUNDRED TWENTY (220) CLASS DAYS", is hereby amended to 3 4 read as follows: "SEC. 3. Start of the School Year. - The school year shall start on the first 5 Monday of June but not later than the last day of August. PROVIDED, THAT IN 6 THE EVENT OF A DECLARATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY OR 7 8 STATE OF CALAMITY, THE PRESIDENT. UPON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE SECRETARY OF EDUCATION, MAY SET A 9

3	In the implementation of this Act, the Secretary of Education[, Culture and

8	Sports] may authorize the holding of Saturday classes for elementary and
9	secondary levels for public and private schools.
